Parent Connection offers speakers to businesses, schools, community agencies, and more on a variety of parenting and child abuse prevention topics. Program fees vary depending on length and location.

## It's time to change how we view a child's growth.

As they grow, children are always learning new things. Below are just some of the things you should look for as your child grows. Use this as a guide, and if you have any concerns, talk with your child's doctor and call **1-800-CDC-INFO** to get connected with your community's early childhood intervention system.

- ▶ **At 6 months, many children**
  - respond to own name
  - respond to other people's emotions and often seem happy
  - copy sounds
  - like to play with others, especially parents
- ▶ **At 1 year (12 months), many children**
  - use simple gestures, like shaking head "no" or waving "bye-bye"
  - say "mama" and "dada" and exclamations like "uh-oh!"
  - copy gestures
  - respond to simple spoken requests
- ▶ **At 1 ½ years (18 months), many children**
  - play simple pretend, such as feeding a doll
  - point to show others something interesting
  - show a full range of emotions, such as happy, sad, angry
  - say several single words
- ▶ **At 2 years (24 months), many children**
  - say sentences with 2 to 4 words
  - follow simple instructions
  - get excited when with other children
  - point to things or pictures when they are named
- ▶ **At 3 years (36 months), many children**
  - show affection for friends without prompting
  - carry on a conversation using 2 to 3 sentences
  - copy adults and friends
  - play make-believe with dolls, animals, and people
- ▶ **At 4 years (48 months), many children**
  - tell stories
  - would rather play with other children than by themselves
  - play cooperatively with others
- ▶ **Questions to ask your child's doctor:**
  - Is my child's development on track for his or her age?
  - How can I track my child's development?
  - What should I do if I'm worried about my child's progress?
  - Where can I get more information?

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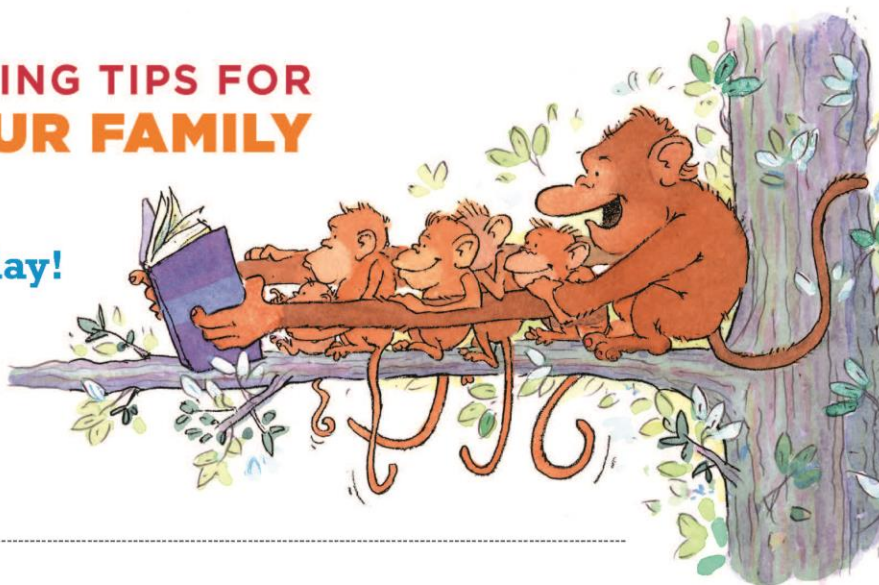

#### MAKE THE STORY COME ALIVE

Read with fun and excitement in your voice.  
Try loud, or soft, or silly voices.

#### A FEW MINUTES IS OKAY

Young children may sit still for only a few minutes. They will listen longer as they grow.

#### TALK ABOUT THE PICTURES

Make up stories to go with the pictures.  
Let your child join in!

#### LET YOUR CHILD TURN THE PAGES

Babies and toddlers need help to turn board book pages. A three-year-old likes to turn paper pages without help.

#### READ ANYWHERE, ANYTIME

Read at playtime, bedtime and naptime. Read any place you have to wait. Read at the playground or under a tree, in the car or on the bus.

#### READ FAVORITE STORIES OVER AND OVER

Children love to hear the same stories again and again. This is how they learn.

#### GO TO YOUR LOCAL LIBRARY TO GET MORE BOOKS

Your local library has lots of free books. Let your child choose which ones to bring home.

#### ASK YOUR CHILD QUESTIONS ABOUT THE STORY

Where is the moon? What do you think will happen next? Be sure to give your child time to answer!

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# MILESTONES OF EARLY LITERACY DEVELOPMENT

## NEWBORN TO 6 MONTHS

**TALK, SING, READ, PLAY** Right from birth, babies are listening, looking, and learning. So find, and enjoy, those everyday moments when you can talk, sing, read, and play together with your baby.



### 6 TO 12 MONTHS

holds head steady  
sits in lap without support  
grasps book, puts in mouth  
drops, throws book

smiles, babbles, coos  
likes and wants your voice  
likes pictures of baby faces  
begins to say "ma," "ba," "da"  
responds to own name  
pats picture to show interest

**MOTOR DEVELOPMENT**  
*What your child is doing*

**COMMUNICATION AND COGNITION**  
*What your child is saying and learning*

**ANTICIPATORY GUIDANCE**

*What parents can do*

**Ask questions and wait for your child to answer**

**Read and speak in your first language**

**WHAT TO READ**

board and cloth books;  
books with baby faces;  
nursery rhymes

### 12 TO 24 MONTHS

holds and walks with book  
no longer puts book in mouth right away  
turns board book pages

says single words, then 2- to 4-word phrases  
gives book to adult to read  
points at pictures  
turns book right-side up  
names pictures, follows simple stories

smile and answer when your child speaks or points  
let your child help turn the pages; keep naming things  
use books in family routines: naptime, playtime, bedtime; on the potty, in the car, bus  
use books to calm or distract your child while waiting

board books; rhyming books;  
picture books; books that name things

### 2 TO 3 YEARS

learns to turn paper pages, 2 to 3 pages at a time  
starts to scribble

adds 2-4 new words per day  
names familiar objects  
likes the same book again and again  
completes sentences and rhymes in familiar stories

ask "Where's the dog?" or "What is that?"  
be willing to read the same book again and again  
as you read, talk about the pictures  
keep using books in daily routines

rhyming books; picture books that tell stories; search and find books

### 3 TO 4 YEARS

turns pages one at a time, and from left to right  
sits still for longer stories  
scribbles and draws

recites whole phrases from books  
moves toward letter recognition  
begins to detect rhyme  
pretends to read to dolls and stuffed animals

ask "What happens next?" in familiar stories  
point out letters, numbers  
point out words and pictures that begin with the same sound  
together, make up stories about the pictures

picture books that tell longer stories; counting and alphabet books

### 4 TO 5 YEARS

starts to copy letters and numbers  
sits still for even longer stories

can listen longer  
recognizes numbers, letters  
can retell familiar stories  
can make rhymes  
learning letter names and sounds

relate the story to your child's own experiences  
let your child see you read  
ask your child to tell the story  
encourage writing, drawing  
point out the letters in your child's name

fairy tales and legends;  
books with longer stories, fewer pictures

### PREVENTION

#### Read Labels

**Learn How to Read a Label for Food Allergens.\* Read Labels Every Time.**

- Food allergens can be hidden in flavorings, colorings or other additives
- Allergens can be hidden ingredients, e.g. milk in canned tuna
- Ingredients may change without notice

**\*You can learn about U.S. labeling for allergens at [www.fda.gov](http://www.fda.gov).**

#### Cross-Contact

**Cross-Contact is the Presence of Unintended Allergens.**

**Do not share** utensils, dishware, cups, water bottles, or food. Wash dishes, utensils, cups, etc. thoroughly, with soap and water.

**Wash hands** well with soap and water or hand wipes, before eating or touching the face. Hand sanitizers don't work.

**Clean tables and eating surfaces** thoroughly with soap and water, commercial cleaners or commercial wipes. Allergens withstand heating and drying.

**Be aware of other sources of exposure** including: saliva from people or pets, sponges, dishrags, sanitizing buckets, aprons, food that touches the allergen, etc.

### EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

- **Epinephrine** (eg. Adrenaclick®, Auvi-Q™, EpiPen® or generic epinephrine auto injector) is the treatment for a severe allergic reaction.
- **Always have epinephrine auto injectors close by.**
  - Know how to give epinephrine.
  - Know when to give epinephrine.
  - Know where the auto injectors are located.
- **Have a Food Allergy Action Plan** available and review it with the parents.
- **After giving epinephrine, always call 911** or local ambulance service and tell them that a child is having an allergic reaction and may need more epinephrine.
