
















OUR MISSION IS TO PROTECT, HEAL, CARE,



I was recently reflecting with a young mom, who I'll call Ashley, about her time in our program. When we'd first met, Ashley was a 17-year-old high school student who was three months pregnant. She was facing the seemingly impossible tasks of finishing school, living on her own, and becoming a mom all at the same time. It was impossible for her to even think of where to start.

We took each goal one at a time and little by little. Three and a half years later, we were astounded at just how much those steps had added up to! Ashley had graduated from high school, gotten her own apartment, started working at a local retail store, and completed a program through Fox Valley Technical College that would allow her to continue furthering her education. Even with ALL of that going on, she always made time for our home visits and the opportunity to learn new parenting skills. As a result, she raised one sweet and smart little boy who is ready to attend Head Start this coming fall.

During our talk, Ashley told me that when she is finished with cosmetology school she would like to donate her time and skills giving free haircuts to moms enrolled in our program. The fact that she would want to give back in that way really moved me and drove home just how important we were to her, and how impactful your support for parents like Ashley truly is.

It is thanks to YOU and your gift to Ashley that she wants to be there for someone who is just starting out where she was all those years ago. For that, I can't thank you enough!

MEET GREG CARE COORDINATOR RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT

One of the most memorable people I've met while working at the Billie Kress Center for Youth Development is a young man who I will call Brian. He came into our care due to significant issues he was having at home, not following his mom's rules, and being physically and verbally aggressive with other kids and adults in his life.

Brian had a really hard time accepting constructive feedback about his behavior. He would often yell and deny that the event or behavior ever happened. If someone pointed out how messy his room was, Brian would argue it wasn't a mess and refuse to clean it. Brian mentioned a time like this to me one day and I saw an opportunity. I asked him, "What was going through your head when that happened?" Brian told me he thought the staff member was targeting him and that they didn't like him. I dug a little deeper and asked how that made him feel. He replied, "It makes me feel like I'm a bad kid."

Over the next few months, Brian and I had many conversations about the feedback he was getting. Every time I would explain to him that a bad choice does not make him a bad person, and no one believes he is a bad kid and neither should he. I told him we wanted to help him build healthier relationships so he could be closer to his family and friends, and teach him ways to take better care of his belongings.

Our conversations paid off. Brian eventually learned how to challenge his inner fears that people were out to get him or didn't like him. He engaged more with the staff and accepted their feedback. He was in crisis less and was much better about doing his chores and participating in activities. He soon made enough positive progress to leave Residential Treatment and return home to his mom's care.

Several months later, Brian called to tell me how great he was doing. He told me that school was going well, he was helping his mom with his brother, and he was excited to go see a monster truck show. His phone call reminded me how important our role is to the young people we serve, and the positive impact your support can have. Thanks to you, this young man who had been stuck feeling like a "bad kid" for so long was finally able to connect with others and feel confident in himself!



MEET VICKY OUTPATIENT THERAPIST COUNSELING CLINIC

A young woman who I will refer to as Vanessa started seeing me for therapy when she was 12 years old. She was getting in trouble at school and at home, as well as engaging in a lot of unsafe behaviors that had landed her in legal trouble. She did not want to see me, and she put up a real tough-girl exterior at first. But beneath it all was a young girl who was really hurting.

Vanessa and I met regularly throughout her teen years, even after she dropped out of school. We developed a real connection. She opened up to me about her mom's mental health struggles and how hard that was on her. Vanessa was also in a relationship and told me her boyfriend didn't treat her well. Over time, with the help of therapy, Vanessa started to make real changes. She studied hard to get her HSED, stopped using drugs or alcohol to cope, and stopped seeing the boyfriend who had been such a negative influence in her life. During one of our last sessions together, I told Vanessa how resilient she was because she had overcome so much adversity to get to where she was.

Vanessa recently returned to therapy with me. It had been several years, but on that first day back she told me she had more to work on and that she never forgot the day I told her how resilient she was. That's when she showed me her tattoo – it was the word "Resilience."

Vanessa told me she chose the tattoo to always remind her of what I had said. When I asked if I could share her story of resilience with others, she was enthusiastic. She wrote down some her thoughts about therapy, sharing, "In my young adult years I have made mistakes and gone through hardships, but I have really taken my life into my own hands. If I never met Vicky, I can't tell you where my life would be."

Seeing Vanessa again got me thinking about the incredible impact your support can have. Sometimes, I might be the only person someone has supporting them and cheering them on. That support really does help people like Vanessa grow and become more resilient adults!

COVID-19 Emergency Fund

At a time when many families struggled to meet their most basic needs, our supporters eagerly stepped up to help. Within a matter of weeks, people like you gave generously to ensure that parents, children, and individuals would have what they need not only to survive but to thrive during the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The Emergency Response Fund has since supplied more than \$30,000 worth of baby items, groceries, clothing, care packages, hygiene supplies, and rental assistance to the people who needed it most during the pandemic.

Responding to Child Abuse

A child abuse investigation is not something that can be postponed. Thanks to you, our Willow Tree Cornerstone Child Advocacy Center and its partners never paused or stopped working together to help kids break free from their abusers this past year.

Sexual abuse continues to be the most commonly disclosed issue at Willow Tree. However, the share of children brought in for allegations of neglect (15%), drug endangerment (17%), and witness to crime (10%) was considerably higher in 2020 than in previous years. This is not because fewer children are being sexually abused, but rather because the most urgent and severe cases of abuse and neglect are the ones that were reported on most often during the pandemic.

Because of you, 458 children were able to be interviewed at Willow Tree in a way that maximized the amount of information received by investigators while at the same time minimizing the amount of trauma a child may have experienced when disclosing abuse. Your continued support ensures even more children will be able to access these services so they can heal and build a bright future!

Children's Campus Takes Shape

This past summer, our Healthy Families Program in Brown County moved in next door to our Willow Tree Cornerstone Child Advocacy Center. Together, they form the new Children's Campus in Green Bay.

Families who are at risk of child abuse and neglect often face challenges in other areas of their lives. This can include financial hardships, mental health issues, substance abuse, or other major life stressors. Effective collaboration between Willow Tree and Healthy Families will allow us to better support all families and their unique needs.

With your continued commitment, the Children's Campus will help us lessen the likelihood of children being abused or neglected in our communities. Being so close together will allow us to collaborate on parenting classes and support groups, and more readily provide referrals to parents and caregivers who may need help fulfilling their basic needs and accessing safe child care

options.

Wisconsin Lifeline

In July 2020, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services awarded us a grant to develop a statewide crisis call center, the Wisconsin Lifeline. This brand new expansion of our crisis services is already helping to prevent suicides and connect callers to local resources within their communities through a wide range of partnerships.

Before the Wisconsin Lifeline, just 30% of calls from people in Wisconsin to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline were answered by in-state providers. The Wisconsin Lifeline is already beginning to change that. In its first months of operation, our specially trained Crisis Counselors answered more than 5,000 calls from individuals living in Wisconsin. Now, more than 81% of calls to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline from people in Wisconsin are answered in state.

With the addition of the Wisconsin Lifeline, our crisis programs answered 26,347 hotline calls last year from callers primarily in Brown County but also statewide. Thanks to your support, we are truly helping more people than ever before get the immediate assistance and follow-up care they need to resolve their crisis, prevent suicide, and begin to move foward toward a bright future!

Welcome Baby Expansion

With the expansion of our Welcome Baby Program in the Fox Valley, Family Services is reaching more families in Northeast Wisconsin from the moment a child is born. Most importantly, new moms and dads who are facing difficult challenges in their lives will be connected to critical support services earlier and more often to help them and their children thrive!

The Welcome Baby Program started in Brown County where, today, almost every new parent who gives birth receives either a visit in the hospital or a packet of information and resources in the mail. Our dedicated team is making great strides already to ensure that every parent who gives birth in the Fox Valley region is connected in some way to the Welcome Baby team and provided with critical information about the resources available.






